His career was anything but illustrious and peaked in 1894 when he was appointed sergeant. After a budget cut demotion 3 years later, he was reprimanded several times for being drunk on duty, demoted to jailer and given a final warning for the same offense in 1907. He retired a year later.

The worst accusation is that he sold his daughter Christine into prostitution, but this story is second or even third-hand. It is true that Christine may have been a "fallen woman." She died at the Bethel Rescue Home for "fallen women and delinquents." The rest of the story is a mystery. It is interesting that most of his reprimands for drunkenness occurred after Christine's death.

In 1905 she was living at Bethel Rescue Home in Duluth, a shelter for "fallen women and delinquent girls." A year later, she was dead from "paralysis," She is buried in Scandia Cemetery in an unmarked grave.
